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with interest thereon from date at the rate of 8 per cent. per annum, to be computed and paid semi-annually... should be deemed by the holder thereof necessary for the protection of his interests to place, and the holder should place, the said note or this mortgage in the hands of an attorney for any legal proceedings, then and in either of said cases the mortgagor promises to pay all costs and expenses, including 10 per cent. of the indebtedness as attorney's fees, this to be added to the mortgage indebtedness, and to be secured under this mortgage as a part of said debt.

NOW, KNOW ALL MEN, That I, the said John Brissey in consideration of the said debt and sum of money aforesaid, and for the better securing the payment thereof to the said G. M. Cox and G. E. at and before the signing of these presents, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, have granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these Presents do grant, bargain, sell and release unto the said G. M. Cox and G. E. Hodgens

All that certain lot or parcel of land situate, lying and being in the City of Greenville, South Carolina, on the South side of Arlington Avenue and having, according to plat made by Dalton & Neves, Engineers, December, 1925, the following metes and bounds, to-wit:- Beginning at a post on the South said of Arlington Avenue, which post is 201 feet west of Calhoun Street, and running thence S. 18-0 W. 150 feet to a stake; thence N. 72-0 W. 50 feet to a stake; thence N. 18-0 E. 150 feet to an iron pin on the South side of Arlington Avenue; thence with the Southern side of said Avenue S. 72-0 E. 50 feet to a post, the point of beginning.

This mortgage is junior to Fifty-three hundred (\$5,300.00) Dollar mortgage to Union Trust Company of Maryland, and American Bank & Trust Company of Greenville, S. C., as Trustees.

For value received, we, G. M. Cox and G. E. Public Records Greenville County in Mortgage Book 209, at page 33, so that the lien of the within mortgage shall in all respects be subject to the mortgage held by the Metropolitan Life Insurance Company.
