at and before the signing of these Presents, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, have granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these Presents do grant, bargain, sell and release unto the said. Board of Trustees of Presbyterian College of South Carolina, A.E.-Spencer, Treasurer, its successors and assigns, All that certain piece, parcel or lot of land situate in what is known as East Overbrook, near the City of Greenville, in the County of Greenville, State of South Carolina, and more particularly described as follows: Beginning at the corner of Lot number Four on the Northeast side of Park Road and running thence with the line of that lot N. 74-50 E. 182.8 feet to a point, the joint corner of lots Nos. 4 & 5; thence S. 24-05 E. 133.3 feet to the corner of portion of lot No. 5 reserved by granter; thence along the line of that lot to a point on Park Road 196.7 ft. distant from & southeast of the point of beginning; thence along the said Park Road N. 24-05 W. 196.7 feet to the beginning corner; being the northern portion of Lot Number Five as shown by plat recorded in Plat Book E, at page 159, and being the northern portion of the said lot number Five conveyed to me by William Goldsmith by his deed dated June 26, 1926 and recorded in R.M.C.
