WHEREAS, I, J. T. Malley, the said J. T. Malley, in and by my certain Promissory note, in writing, of even date with these presents, am well and truly indebted to N. K. Townes,

Attorney, in the full and just sum of Six Hundred Fifty (\$650.00) Dollars, to be paid November, 5, 1929.

with interest thereon, from date, at the rate of eight per cent. per annum to be computed and paid annually, until paid in full; all interest not paid when due to bear interest at the same rate as principal; and if any portion of principal or interest be at any time past due and unpaid, then the whole amount evidenced by said note to become immediately due, at the option of the holder hereof, who may sue thereon and foreclose this mortgage, said note further providing for an attorney's fee of Ten percent on

amount due and unpaid, besides all costs and expenses of collection, to be added to the amount due on said note, to be collectible as a part thereof, if the same be placed in the hands of an attorney for collection, or if said debt, or any part thereof, be collected by an attorney or by legal proceedings of any kind (all of which is secured under this mortgage); as in and by the said note, reference being thereto had, as will more fully appear.

NOW, KNOW ALL MEN, That I, J. T. Malley, in consideration of the said debt and sum of money aforesaid, and for the better securing the payment thereof to the said N. K. Townes, Attorney, according to the terms of the said note, and also in consideration of the further sum of Three Dollars, to me, the said J. T. Malley, in hand well and truly paid by the said N. K. Townes, Attorney,

at and before the signing of these Presents, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, have granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these Presents do grant, bargain, sell and release unto the said N. K. Townes, attorney his heirs and assigns forever, all that certain piece parcel of tract of land with the improvements thereon situate lying and being in the State of South Carolina and County of Greenville in Bates Township and having the following mites and bounds according to a plat of Corded in the R.M.C. Office for said County and State in Deed Bk. 106, page 301.

Begging at a stone 3x0m on old line and running thence N. 31 $\frac{3}{4}$ E. 41.80 to a Hickory 3 x0m; thence N. 19 $\frac{2}{3}$ W. 32.50 to a black gum 3x0m; thence S. 24- $\frac{1}{10}$ W. 15.40 to a small pine 3x0 (one small sassafras); thence N. 84- $\frac{1}{2}$ W. 17.15 to a rock 3x0m; (Henry Evans Spring) thence S. 45- $\frac{1}{2}$ W. 33.05 to a Chestnut 3x; thence S. 11 E. 27.00 to a stone 3x0m; thence S. 20 $\frac{1}{2}$ E. 12.68 to a red oak 3x0m; thence N. 57 W. 25.37 to the beginning corner and containing two hundred and fifty-five (255) acres, more or less and being the same tract of land conveyed by S. F. Bailey by deed dated January 26, 1921, to R. F. Craig and Annie Craig, and by the said Anne Craig and R. F. Craig conveyed to J. T. Malley by deed dated July 25, 1923 and recorded in the R.M.C.
