TITLE 5. RURAL ESTATE MORTGAGE FOR SOUTH CAROLINA

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS, Dated Aug. 19, 1975
THEREAS, the undersigned David W. Branch and Mary Sue F. Branch,

residing Greenville, 166 Sparsewood Drive, Simpsonville, County, South Carolina, whose post office address is 29681, herein called "Borrower," are (is) jointly indebted to the United States of America, acting through the Farmers Home Administration, United States Department of Agriculture, herein called the "Government," as evidenced by one or more certain promissory note(s) or assumption agreement(s), herein called "note" (if more than one note is described below the word "note" as used herein shall be construed as referring to each note singly or all notes collectively, as the context may require, said note being executed by Borrower, being payable to the order of the Government in installments as specified therein, authorizing acceleration of the entire indebtedness at the option of the Government upon any default by Borrower, and being further described as follows:

And the note evidences a debt to Borrower, and the Government, at any time, may assign the note and insure the payment thereof pursuant to the Consolidated Farm and Rural Development Act, or Title V of the Housing Act of 1949.

And it is the purpose and intent of this instrument that, among other things, at all times when the note is held by the Government, or at the event the Government should assign this instrument without insurance of the same, this instrument shall secure payment of the note, but when the note is held by an insured holder, this instrument shall not secure payment of the note or attach to the debt evidenced thereby, but as to the note and such debt shall constitute an ordinaria mortgage to secure the Government against loss under its insurance contract to reason of any default by Borrower.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the above, and at all times when the note is held by the Government, or at the event the Government should assign this instrument without insurance of the payment of the note, to secure prompt payment of the note and any renewals and extensions thereof and any agreements contained therein, including any provision for the payment of an insurance to other charge, it is at all times when the note is held by an insured holder, to secure performance of Borrower's agreement herein to defend and save harmless the Government against loss under its insurance contract of any default by Borrower, and at any event and at all times to secure the prompt payment of all advances and expenditures made to the Government, with interest, as hereinafter described, and the performance of every covenant and agreement of Borrower contained herein or in any supplemental agreement, Borrower does hereby grant, bargain, sell, release, and assign unto the Government, with general warrants, the following property situated in the State of South Carolina, County of Greenville:

ALL that lot of land with the buildings and improvements thereon situate on the north side of Sparsewood Street, near the Town of Simpsonville, Austin Township, in Greenville County, South Carolina being shown as Lot 114 on Plat of Section II, Sheet No. 1 of Westwood Subdivision, recorded in the RMC Office for Greenville, S.C. in Plat Book 4-F, Page 44 and having, according to said plat, the following metes and bounds, to-wit:

BEGINNING at an iron pin on the north side of Sparsewood Street at the joint corner of Lots 113 and 114 and runs thence along the line of Lot 113 N. 7-18 E. 155 feet to an iron pin; thence along the line of Lots 117 and 116 N. 85-51 W. 90 feet to an iron pin; thence along the line of Lot 115 S. 7-18 W. 155 feet to an iron pin on the north side of Sparsewood Street; thence along Sparsewood Street S. 85-51 E. 90 feet to the beginning corner.

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
