


Kickoff Event

- Initial event where we grilled out, played games, and got to know the NWH community members better
- Mapping activity to begin to receive ideas for the 27 acre space
- Had 42 participants

- Had 16 participants

Door-to-Door Canvassing

- Walked around NWH with Community Association members
- Conducted short interviews to gather more input from the neighborhood
- Spoke with 27 people, 24 of whom were new respondents

Visioning Workshop

- Based on input from previous events, created posters focused on common themes
- Stations allowed community members to flow through room to provide input
- 10 participants; half were first time respondents









 - Summer Camp












