execution of this contract and to manage the same to his best judgement during the life of
this contract.

That for and in consideration of the promises and as a compensation for said work of E.E.Southern said Mrs. E.J. Shankle does hereby promise and agree to pay him the sum of four hundred
(\$400.00) Dollars, and he is hereby authorized to retain a monthly sum of twenty (\$25.00)
dollars at the end of each month for the process of said Farm and School, and he is to have free
of charge board, and a furnished bed room of his selection in said Building. And this sum shall be
and constitute a prior lien on all proceeds of said Farm and School to the exclusion of all other
expenses until paid.
