

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS, that the American Pipe & Construction Company, formerly the American Pipe Manufacturing Company, a corporation chartered under the laws of the State of New Jersey, for and in consideration of the sum of One (\$1.00) Dollar, paid by The Paris Mountain Water Company, a corporation organized under the laws of South Carolina, and doing business in the State of South Carolina, the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, has granted, bargained, sold and released and by these presents does grant, bargain, sell and release unto The Paris Mountain Water Company, its successors and assigns, a right of way over ALL THAT CERTAIN LOT OF LAND, situate and lying in the City and County of Greenville, State of South Carolina, and having the following metes and bounds, to wit:

BEGINNING at an iron pin on the sidewalk on Hammon Street thirty-nine and seven-tenths (39.7) feet, from the corner of Main Street and Hammond Street and running thence North thirty-eight degrees forty minutes (38° 40") East two hundred and twenty-four and three tenths (224.3) feet to an iron pin in the center of the C. & W.C. R.R. Siding at the rear of R.E. Allen & Bro. Company's store; thence South thirty-five degrees seventeen minutes (35° 17") West sixty-two and six tenths (62.6) feet to an iron pin; thence South thirty-eight degrees thirty minutes (38° 30") West one hundred and thirty-two and nine tenths (132.9) feet to the corner of Main and Hammond Streets; thence along the edge of the sidewalk on Hammond Street North thirty-six degrees thirty minutes (36° 30") West thirty nine and seven tenths (39.7) feet to the beginning corner.

For the purpose of laying their pipes or conduits to conduct water, with the privilege of entering upon the same and making such excavations, fills and levels as may be requisite and of making such repairs and laying other pipes as may from time to time be necessary, the location of said right of way being more particularly described in plot or plan now being prepared to be attached hereto and made a part hereof, being of a width of five (5) feet from either side of the pipe or conduits as now laid and constructed.

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD all and singular the rights and privileges hereunto granted to The Paris Mountain Water Company, its successors and assigns, forever.
