KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS, That Town of Greer

a corporation chartered under the laws of the State of South Carolina and having its principal place of business at Greer, S.C. in the State of South Carolina for and in consideration of the sum of Eighty Two Hundred Dollars, to it in hand duly paid at and before the sealing and delivery of these presents by the grantee... hereinabove named, (the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged) has granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these presents does grant, bargain, sell and release unto Franklin Mill, all that certain piece, parcel or lot of land situate lying and being in Greenville County and State aforesaid, and near the Town of Greer and having the following metes and bounds to wit: Beginning at an old iron-rod in the center of the Brushy Creek Road, and running thence with the line of J. F. Strood N. 31° 19' E. 874.5 feet to a wooden stake near a large pine on the line of Noah Cannon; thence with the line of Noah Cannon 21.54.20 N. 504.9 feet to the center line of the Southern Railway; thence south west with the center line of said Railway 454.1 feet; thence S. 33.17 E. 1314.0 feet to a wooden stake in the Brushy Creek Road; thence N. 43.48 E. 100.4 feet to the beginning corner, and containing Twelve and  $\frac{25}{100}$  (12.25) acres more or less. And being the same lot or parcel of land conveyed to the said Town of Greer by P. H. Green by deed bearing date of July 11th 1914, and recorded in the office of P. M. C. for Greenville County in Vol. 26 page 343.

TOGETHER with, all and singular, the rights, members, hereditaments and appurtenances to the said premises belonging or in anywise incident or appertaining.

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD, all and singular, the premises before mentioned unto the grantee... hereinabove named, and *its* heirs and assigns forever.

And the said granting corporation does hereby bind itself and its successors to warrant and forever defend all and singular the said premises unto the grantee... hereinabove named, and *its* heirs and assigns, against itself and its successors, and against every person whomsoever lawfully claiming or to claim the same or any part thereof.

In witness whereof the said granting corporation has caused its corporate seal to be hereunto affixed and these presents to be subscribed by its duly authorized officers, W. L. James, Mayor pro-tem and T. W. White, Clerk & Treasurer, on this the 5th day of December, in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and seventeen, and in the one hundred and forty-second year of the Sovereignty and Independence of the United States of America.
