(the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged), have Granted, Bargained, Sold and Released, and by these presents do Grant, Bargain, Sell and Release, unto the said W. P. Neslitt, all that tract and parcel of land, lying being and situated in County and State aforesaid, containing four and one-half acres of Reedy River and on East side of Martin's Creek, containing two hundred thirty-seven and $\frac{1}{2}$ acres, more or less, and having the following lines and bounds; commencing at Willow Stake, East bank Martin's Creek near old ford; thence N. 74 1/2 E. 58.50 to stone on branch, R. L.
