- 2. Visitors will be admitted to the Cemetery at all times during the day, observing the rules which may be adopted for the regulation of visitors.
- 3. An order in writing is required of a lot owner whenever a grave is to be opened, and a permit from the Board of Health must be shown the Super-
- 4. No double burials (that is, one body being placed above another) will be allowed, unless special permission be granted by the Siperintendent.
- 5. No disinterment shall be allowed without permission of the Superintendent.
- 6. The Association, from time to time, may lay out or alter such avenues or walks, or make such rules and regulations for the government of the Cemetery grounds as they may deem requisite or proper to promote the general objects of the Cemetery.
- 7. The prices of lots include all charges for grading and care in accordance with the rules and regulations laid down by the Association and as referred to in Rule No. 10. 8. All sales of lots are made strictly for cash, unless in special cases an extension is given by the Association. When an interment is made on a lot not fully paid for, the Association reserves the right at any time after the period agreed on for any extension of payment to remove the remains to a smaller lot equal in value to the amount paid upon the original, or to a single grave.
