DEED TO Hattie P. Ayers

NOW, KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS, That I, O. M. Goodlett, of the County of Greenville, in the State aforesaid in consideration of the sum of Two Hundred Dollars and other valuable considerations DOLLARS, to me in hand paid at and before the sealing of these presents by Hattie P. Ayers,

(the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged) have Granted, Bargained, Sold and Released, and by these Presents do Grant, Bargain, Sell and Release unto the said Hattie P. Ayers, all that certain lot, piece or parcel of land situate, lying and being in the State of South Carolina, and County of Greenville, in the Fifth Ward of the City of Greenville, known and designated as lot number five (5) in plat dated February 26, 1913, and recorded in the office of the Register of Deeds Conveyances for said County and State in Plat Book 6 at page 223, and having according to said plat, the following metes and bounds, to wit: Beginning at a stake on the South side of Arlington Avenue, (formerly known as Garlington Street) one hundred and fifty-seven (157) feet westward from the southwest corner of Arlington Avenue and Memminger Street and running thence along said Arlington Avenue, N. 73° 45' W. fifty (50) feet to a stake on corner of lot 720, thence along line of lot mentioned lot 816.15 N. 73° 45' W. hundred and seventy-five (175) feet to a stake on a fifteen (15) foot alley, thence along said alley S. 73° 45' E. fifty (50) feet to a stake on the lines of lot 720, thence N. 16° 30' E. one hundred and seventy-five (175) feet along lines of lot mentioned 8,700 feet to the beginning corner, and being the same lot aforesaid conveyed to me by H. Miller, by deed bearing date April 8th, 1913, and recorded in the Office for said County and State in Book 70 volume 34 page 288.

TOGETHER with, all and singular, the rights, members, hereditaments and appurtenances to the said premises belonging or in anywise incident or appertaining, TO HAVE AND TO HOLD, all and singular, the said premises before mentioned unto the said Hattie P. Ayers, her heirs and assigns, forever.

AND I do hereby bind myself and my heirs, executors and administrators, to warrant and forever defend, all and singular, the said premises unto the said Hattie P. Ayers, her

heirs and assigns, against me and my heirs, and against every person whomsoever lawfully claiming or to claim the same, or any part thereof.
