DEED TO J. W. Bell

NOW, KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS, That I, Mary M. Calhoun, of Greenville, in the State aforesaid, in consideration of the sum of \$350.00 DOLLARS, to me in hand paid at and before the sealing of these presents by J. W. Bell of Greenville,

(the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged) have Granted, Bargained, Sold and Relented, and by these Presents do Grant, Bargain, Sell and Release unto the said J. W. Bell all that piece, parcel or lot of land in the City of Greenville County and State aforesaid, and having the following lines or boundaries courses and distances; Beginning at a stake on St. John Street, 100 feet east of Green Ave. being the corner of a lot sold to William Bush and running in a westerly direction fifty-nine (59) feet more or less, to lot known as Bowens lot, thence in an easterly direction, along said lot fifty (50) feet to line of the Hammond lot, thence, in a southerly direction fifty-one and one-third (51 1/3) feet, to St. John Street, thence along said street, in a westerly direction, fifty (50) feet, or less, to the garrison point, and being the eastern part of the same lot conveyed to me and E. L. Calhoun by Will Ingles, by deed dated Feb 1, 1905, said E. L. Calhoun having conveyed his interest in the same to me by deed dated Mar 3, 1915, as a part of the consideration of this deed the grantee herein assumes the payment of a note and mortgage on the said lot herein described, which note and mortgage is duly recorded in Vol 52, page 41 and is for \$350⁰⁰ payable to Miss Mary A. TO HAVE AND TO HOLD, all and singular, the said premises before mentioned unto the said J. W. Bell and his heirs and assigns, forever.

AND I do hereby bind myself and my heirs, executors and administrators, to warrant and forever defend, all and singular, the said premises unto the said J. W. Bell and his heirs and assigns, against all and every person whomsoever lawfully claiming or to claim the same, or any part thereof.
