NOW, KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS, That I, Alvin H. Dean,

in the State aforesaid
 in consideration of the sum of Ten Dollars and other valuable considerations DOLLARS,
 to me in hand paid at and before the sealing of these presents by W. B. and Fred Carpenter

(the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged) have Granted, Bargained, Sold and Released, and by these Presents do Grant, Bargain, Sell and Release unto the said

W. B. and Fred Carpenter an undivided one half interest in and to the following described lot or parcel of land to wit:
 All that piece, parcel or lot of land situate, lying and being in Ward One 111 of the City of Greenville, in the State and County aforesaid, beginning at an iron pin, corner of Cooke and King Streets; thence along Cooke Street S. 21° E. thirty-five (35) feet to an iron pin; thence N. 21° W. thirty-five (35) feet to an iron pin; thence N. 21° W. thirty-five (35) feet to an iron pin on King Street; thence along King Street S. 87° W. Ninety-five (95) feet to the beginning corner. Bounded on the North by King Street, on the West by Cooke Street, and on the South and East by lands of W. J. Bellamy, being a part of the real estate of Dr. Alfred J. York, deceased, conveyed by D. R. Deener, Master, to W. J. Bellamy and J. C. Payne, conveyance recorded in R. M. C.
