John Byrd, and his heirs and assigns, the following described real estate, to-wit: First: All that certain piece, parcel or tract of land situate, lying and being in the State of South Carolina, and County of Greenville, in Butler Township, about 2 1/2 miles N. E. H. and having the following metes and bounds, to-wit: Beginning on a pine 34 rods running thence N. 11° 26' E. 2.68 to a rock 34 on road; thence N. 85 E. 1.62 to a rock on same road; thence S. 81 1/2 E. 5.27 to another 34 on road; thence S. 71 1/2 W. 61 to the beginning above containing nine-tenths (.9) of an acre, more or less; Second: All that certain piece, parcel or tract of land situate, lying and being in the same County and Township, adjoining the above tract and having the following metes and bounds, to-wit: Beginning at a post-oh; thence S. 73 1/2 W. 61 to a claim to a stone; 340 m; thence S. 21 1/2 W. 61 to a peach tree; 340; thence S. 77 E. 5.95 to a stone; 340; thence N. 25 1/2 E. 9.25 to the beginning above containing four and one-fourth (4 1/4) acres more or less; These being the same two tracts of land conveyed to me by Susan Fissel by Deed dated 9th October 1914, and recorded in the R.
