Master in and for the County of Greenville, aforesaid, in consideration of the sum of  
Twenty-two hundred (\$2200.00) Dollars,  
to me paid by the said H.M. Hester

the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, HAVE GRANTED, bargained, sold and released, and by these Presents DO GRANT, bargain, sell and release  
unto the said H.M. Hester, the following described real estate, to-wit: -

That those certain lots of land in the City of Greenville, State and County aforesaid,  
being lots Nos. 10, 11, 12, 13, 14, 15 and 16 according to plat recorded in plat book A., et  
page 163 in R.M.C. Office for Greenville County, having the following metes and bounds, to-wit:  
Beginning on the south side of Dunbar Street, corner of lot No. 17, running thence with  
Dunbar Street N. 76 W. 355 feet; thence S.W. along the line of Martin (formerly Willimon)  
215 feet; thence S. 76 E. 355 feet to corner of lot No. 17 on rear line; thence N.E. 215  
feet to the beginning corner, and being a part of the land conveyed to W.H. Irvine by  
J.W. Howell, deed recorded in Vol. 000, at page 277, in said R.M.C. Office."
