unto the said H. P. Congers and T. C. Gowen

All that certain piece, parcel or tract of land, situated,
lying and being in the County and State aforesaid, on the
North side of the Anderson road, at Burnham Bridge, about
ten (10) acres, more or less, and having the following
metes and bounds as shown on plat of said land by
J. N. Southern, Surveyor, dated August 18th - 1914 to wit:
Beginning at a white oak 3 ft on the East side of Burnham
bridge; thence with the fence of the Old Anderson road,
2.00 chains to a bend; thence with said road 5.00 chains


