KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS, That J. M. M. Tankersley
of the County of Greenville

in the State aforesaid,

in consideration of the sum of

Ten (\$10.00) Dollars and other valuable considerations DOLLARS,

to me in hand paid

at and before the sealing of these presents by

D. L. Potts

(the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged), have Granted, Bargained, Sold and Released, and by these presents do Grant, Bargain, sell and Release unto the said

D. L. Potts:

All that piece, parcel and tract of land containing eighteen (18) acres, more or less, situate, lying and being in the County and State aforesaid, in Cleveland Township, on the Gap Creek road and waters of Gap Creek of middle Saluda River, and having the following metes and bounds, to-wit:

Beginning on a cherry tree near a large chinquapin on the Gap Creek road, and thence a straight line westerly to a persimmon tree on the west bank of flat branch in the line of Alexander Smith, deceased; thence with said line to Harriet Johnson's corner; thence with her line to the Gap Creek road; thence down said road a southwest course to the beginning corner, (being the same tract of land conveyed to me by E. J. Mullinax by his deed dated Aug. 6th. 1903, and recorded in R. M. C. office for Greenville County in Vol. J. J. page 428.)

Also, all that other piece, parcel or lot of land in Saluda Township, Greenville County, State of South Carolina, on the north side of the Gap Creek road, containing five (5) acres, more or less: Beginning on a wild cherry near the north side of the Gap Creek road, and running thence in a northwesterly direction with the line of M. M. Tankersley, crossing a branch to a persimmon on the west bank of the branch; thence with the meanders of the branch in a southerly direction to the middle of the Gap Creek road; thence with the road in a northeasterly direction to where it intersects Tankersley's line, and thence continuing northeast by north with Tankersley's line to the beginning corner, and being the same tract of land conveyed to me by Wm. S. Sirrute by his deed dated Aug. 11th. 1914, and recorded in R. M. C. office for Greenville County in Book. 20, page 213)
