Lucy Seaborn Autrey, her heirs and assigns forever, the following described real estate: "All that certain lot or parcel of land in the County and State aforesaid, about one and one-half miles from Greenville Courthouse, lying between the Anderson Road and the C. & G. Railroad, and known as lot No. 7 of W.W. Seaborn's estate, and being the same lot devised by W.W. Seaborn to the said W.H. Seaborn, known as Worth Seaborn, by the will of the said W.W. Seaborn on file in the Probate Judge's Office for Greenville County in Apartment 132, File 14".
