the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, HAVE GRANTED, bargained, sold and released, and by these Presents DO GRANT, bargain, sell and release unto the said.

H.P. McGee, his heirs and assigns forever, the following described real estate to-wit: "All that certain piece, parcel and tract of land lying and being in the County of Greenville State of South Carolina, about sixteen miles from the City of Greenville and having the following metes and bounds, to-wit: Beginning at a small Dogwood on branch; thence with the meanders of said branch in an Easterly direction to a stone; thence N. 54 1/2 E. 7.50 chains to a stone; thence N. S W. 8.00 chains to stone NM; thence N. 53 1/2 W. 33.90 chains to stone; thence S. 20 1/2 E. 17.40 chains to Hickory; thence S. 8.90 chains to Hickory; thence S. 52 1/2 E. 11.00 chains to the beginning corner, and containing forty-one and one-half (41 1/2) acres, more or less, and bounded by lands of John Cox, T.Q.
