

The State of South Carolina.

Whereas, J.E. Hagood the elder departed this life leaving of full force and effect his last will and testament, dated 11, September 1897, which was duly admitted to Probate in the Court of Probate for Pickens County, State of South Carolina, on 6th, June 1904, in which testator made the following disposition of his residuary estate: "It is my will that the balance of my property both real and personal shall be divided equally among all my children, share and share alike", and Whereas whatever interest the said J.E. Hagood had at the time of his death in and to the property hereinafter described constitute the part of his residuary estate, and

Whereas the children referred to in said will were W.M. Hagood, a son Mrs. Mary E. Alexander, a daughter, J.E. Hagood, a son, Mrs. Lucie H. Bruce, a daughter, Benjamin A. Hagood, a son, Mrs. Francis H. Mauldin, a daughter, and

Whereas thereafter the said J.E. Hagood, the younger, departed this life leaving of full force and effect his last Will and Testament which was duly admitted to Probate in the Court of Probate for Pickens County, S.C. in November 1918, in which he devised and bequeathed all of his estate of which his one-sixth (1/6) interest in the property of his father constitutes the part to be equally divided between his widow, Dora F. Hagood, and his son Benjamin F. Hagood, and

Whereas the said Mary E. Alexander departed this life in May 1921, leaving of full force and effect her last will and testament and codicil thereto which was admitted to Probate in the Court of Probate for Pickens County, the 14th, day of May 1921, wherein among other things testatrix devised and bequeathed all of her property to her brother Benjamin A. Hagood, to be held by him in trust, conferring upon said Trustee in his discretion to sell, alien and otherwise dispose of any portion of her estate so devised and bequeathed, and

Whereas we the said W.M. Hagood, Lucie H. Bruce, Benjamin A. Hagood, Francis H. Mauldin, Dora F. Hagood, Benjamin F. Hagood and Benjamin A. Hagood as Trustee, under the ~~said~~ last Will and Testament and codicil thereto of Mary E. Alexander, deceased, are minded to quit claim all our right, title and interest and estate and that the late J.E. Hagood, the elder, J.E. Hagood the younger, and Mary E. Alexander in and to the property hereinafter described.

Now, Therefore, Know all men by these presents, That we, W.M. Hagood, Lucie H. Bruce, Benjamin A. Hagood, Francis H. Mauldin, Dora F. Hagood, Benjamin F. Hagood and Benjamin A. Hagood, as Trustee, in consideration of the sum of Ten (\$10.00) Dollars and other valuable consideration, to us in hand paid at and before the sealing of these presents by Seluda Land and Lumber Company, a corporation duly chartered, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, have granted, bargained, sold, quit claimed and released, and by these Presents do grant, bargain, sell, quit claim and release unto Seluda Land and Lumber Company, all our right, title and interest in and to All that piece, parcel or tract of land, situate, lying and being in Greenville County, State of South Carolina, measuring and containing eighty-eight (88) acres, and having such buttings, boundings, shape and dimensions as appear on plat thereof, designated "Map of land owned by J.E. Hagood, Greenville County, South Carolina, Area 88 acres", hereto annexed and made a part of this quit claim deed.

Together with all and singular, the Rights, Members, Hereditaments and appurtenances to the said premises belonging, or in anywise incident or appertaining.

To have and to hold all and singular the said Premises before mentioned unto the said Seluda Land and Lumber Company, its successors and assigns forever.

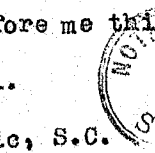
