Lease

This agreement entered into this May 1st 1921 between Dr. R. L. Merchant, hereinafter called party of the first part and the Green Drug Company, hereinafter called party of the second part to wit:

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Party of the first part hereby leases unto party of the second part for a period of three years, beginning May 1st 1921 and ending May 1st 1924, the following described premises in the town of Greenville, said State and County: All of the lower floor of that three story brick building, situated at the intersection of Trade and Victoria Streets and adjoining property of the Littlefield Estate, B. T. Few and others. And party of the first part agrees also to lease, for a like period of three years, to party of the second part, the following described premises: Four office rooms in the second story of the above described building, one Metal Ice Cream house located at the side and rear of above described building, and the wooden warehouse located to the West and south of above described building, for a monthly rental of One Hundred, Twenty and $\frac{1}{2}$ Dollars (\$120.00) payable at the beginning of each month.

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The party of the second part agrees to pay the rental as mentioned herein and agrees further to keep good care of the premises leased unto it and to leave them at the expiration of this lease in as good condition as at present, reasonable wear and tear excepted.

Whereas, D. D. Davenport, of Greenville, S.C., R. E. Allen of Greenville S.C. and W. L. Gassaway of Greenville S.C. did on the 19th day of August 1898 file with the secretary of state a written declaration signed by themselves, setting forth:

First: The names and residences of the said petitioners to be as above given;

Second: The name of the proposed corporation to be that of "Eagle Roller Mills" The principal place of business of the Corporation will be Greenville, S.C. The general purpose of the corporation is to establish and operate a Roller Flouring Mill, Grist Mill and Milling grain; and disposing of the products

Third: The amount of the capital stock to be Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000.00) divided into shares of One Hundred of the par value of one hundred dollars each.

On the 19th day of August 1898, the said above named petitioners were commissioned by me a Board of Corporators, authorizing and empowering them to open books of subscription to the capital stock of said proposed Corporation, giving not less than one day's previous notice, by advertisement, in the - - - - - A News paper published in the County of Greenville, giving notice of the time and place where said books of subscription would be open;

And whereas, The said board of Corporators, on the 19th day of November 1898, did file with the secretary of state their
