Railroad, Beginning at a stake at the corner of Alonso Seaborn's lot on the right of way of said Railroad, and running thence N. 018-45 W. 167 feet to a stake thence N. 89-6.62 feet to a stake, thence S. 18-45 E. 104 feet to a stake on the right of way of said railroad thence with said right of way S. 74 W. 62 feet to the beginning corner and being lot number 4 as referred to in the last will and testament of W. W. Seaborn, deceased.
