(the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged) have Granted, Bargained, Sold and Released, and by these presents do Grant, Bargain, Sell and Release unto the said G. L. Willimon all our right, title and interest of in and to all that tract of land situate, lying and being in Paris Mountain Township, Greenville County, South Carolina on the north side of Saluda River about six miles from Greenville County Court House, adjoining lands of W. H. Willimon, Mrs. Parr, and the Bruce Estate and having the following metes and bounds;

Beginning at an iron pin in the Parr Bridge Road down the line between Willimon and Means road running of Parr's Bridge; thence up the river with the meanders of said river above high water mark 34.00 to a beach 320m, thence 8.62 E. 7.80 to a pine 320m, thence 216 $\frac{1}{4}$ E. 5.00 to a white oak 340m, thence 216 $\frac{1}{4}$ E. 6.64 links to a stake at mouth of branch thence up the meanders of the branch 10.40 to a maple 320 at mouth of spring branch, thence the spring branch 4.75 to a pine above the spring; thence S. 38 E. 6.75 to the beginning containing forty-one and one-half acres more or less, and being the same tract of land conveyed to J.
