(the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged), have Granted, Bargained, Sold and Released, and by these presents do Grant, Bargain, Sell and Release unto the said Saluda Land and Lumber Company, a Delaware Corporation duly authorized to do business in the State of South Carolina, its successors and assigns; all that certain tract or parcel of land situate, lying and being on Gap Creek, waters of Middle Saluda River, Cleveland Township, Greenville County, State of South Carolina, containing in the aggregate 305 acres more or less, designated as Tracts 1, 2 and 3 on a plat thereof made by J. W. Mace C. E. December 1919, which plat duly appears of record in the office of the Register of Deeds Conveyances in and for Greenville County, State of South Carolina, in Plat Book E at page reference to which plat is hereby made for all purposes being the same land conveyed to me, the said L. M. Carlson by deed from W. M. Tinkersley bearing date January 13th, 1920 and recorded in the office of the Register of Deeds Conveyances aforesaid in Volume 5 of Deeds at page 4513, January 16th 1920, and which said land, Tracts Numbers 1, 2 and 3 are as a whole more particularly described by metes and bounds as established and determined by the Survey made thereof by J. W. Mace, C. E. as follows, to wit: Beginning at a white oak (down) on the west line of the W. S. N. 28.33 chains to corner in edge of branch, thence N. 1° E. 36.25 chains to stone J. Norwood and R. Maye Cleveland line, thence S. 64° 41' 38. 23.00 chains to White Oak (stone), thence S. 67° 03' 31. 29.82 chains to stone; thence S. 47° 23.26 chains to stone, thence S. 39° 30' E. 39.44 chains to stone, thence N. 55° 6. 154 chains, thence N. 48° 30' E. 13.29 chains to large stone, thence S. 42° 30' E. 7.26 chains to stake, thence N. 54° 45' E. 13.79 chains to pine, thence N. 50° E. 12.30 chains to stake; thence N. 60° E. 2.51 chains to white oak (down) the beginning corner.
