WHEREAS, T.S. Inglesby, F.J.P. Cogswell and T.H. Boyd, all of Greenville, S.C.

did on the 14th day of June, 1923, file with the Secretary of State a written Declaration signed by themselves, setting forth:

FIRST: That their names and residences are as above given.

SECOND: That the name of the proposed Corporation is Palmetto Loom-Harness & Reed Works

THIRD: That the principal place of business is Greenville, S.C.

FOURTH: That the general nature of the business which it is proposed to do is To manufacture, repair, buy and sell, loom-harness, reeds, and all textile supplies and specialties, and to do both a domestic and foreign business; to buy, hold and sell real estate, and exercise all other powers conferred upon corporations organized under the laws of this State.

SEVENTH: That, after due notice, a meeting of the subscribers was held on the 12th day of June, 1923, at which a majority of all stock in value being present in person or by proxy, the following were elected directors: T.S. Inglesby, F.J.P. Cogswell and T.H. Boyd.

EIGHTH: That subsequently there was elected as President F.J.P. Cogswell as Vice-President, T.S. Inglesby; as Secretary, T.H. Boyd

NINTH: That all requirements of Chapter XLVII, Article I, of the Civil Code of South Carolina, 1912, and all amendments thereto, have been duly and fully complied with, 50 per cent. of the aggregate amount of the capital stock having been subscribed by bona fide subscribers, 20 per cent. of the capital stock subscribed having been paid to the Treasurer, and three days' public notice of the intention to file this Declaration with the Secretary of State having been given in The Daily Piedmont newspaper published in the County of Greenville
