Daniel, all of the State aforesaid, in consideration of the sum of One Dollar, to each of us in hand paid at and before the sealing of these presents by Thomas Harrison, (the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged), have granted, bargained, Add and released, and quit claimed and by these Presents do grent, bargain, quit claim 1622/ and release unto the said Thomas Harrison and his heirs and assigns forever, all our right, title and interest in and to the estate of Gertrude-Robins Harrison; both real and personal.

Said property being more particularly described in the deed of conveyance from Partha Littlefieldto Tom Harrison, dated March 23, 1922, and recorded in the R.M.C. Office for Greenville County, in Deed Book 62, at page 550.

Together with all and singular the rights, members, hereditaments and appurtenances to the said premises belonging, or in anywise incident or appertaining.

To have and to hold all and singular the premises above mentioned unto the said Thomas Harrison and his heirs and assigns forever.

And we do hereby bind ourselves and our heirs, executors and administrators to warrant and forever defind all and singular the sand premises buto the said Thomas Harrison and his hours and assigns egains us and our heirs.
