(the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged), have Granted, Bargained, Sold and Released, and by these presents do Grant, Bargain, Sell and Release unto the said
Milton G. Smith: All that piece, parcel or lot of Land in Gantt Township, Greenville County, State of South Carolina, on the east side of the Augusta Road, adjoining lands of Julia D. Charles and Aug. W. Smith, having the following courses and distances according to survey made by R.E. Dalton, Engineer, on August 8th, 1923:
Commencing at a stake in center of Augusta Road, corner of property of Julia D. Charles, thence along center of Augusta Road S. 26-16 E. 500 feet to a bend in said road; thence continuing with road S. 46 E. 153.5 feet to a stake, corner of Aug. W. Smith property; thence along line of Aug. W. Smith property N. 63-10 E. 3845 feet to a point at the mouth of Brushy Creek; thence with the meanderings of said Creek in a northwest direction 3535 feet to a Birch tree on the north bank of Brushy Creek; thence with line of property of Julia D. Charles S. 30-30 E. 1340 feet to a stone; thence with line of same property S. 50 W. 1318 feet to stone; thence continuing with same property S. 26-30 W. 679.3 feet to the point of beginning.
