Beginning at point on the East side of Hudson Street, at the intersection of the line of this lot hereby conveyed, with the North line of W.C. Gibson's lot a distance of 50 ft. from the line of lot now or formerly owned by Mrs. Mary Sanders, running thence with line of W.C. Gibson's S. 60° E. 97 feet 3 in. more or less; thence with line of Mrs. Stella H. Ellis, intersected by this line N. 26 1/2 E. 50 feet, to the line of lot of Mrs. Mary R.
