This Indenture made this Fleventh day of July in the year Nineteen Hundred and Twenty-four, between Woodside Cotton Mills Company, Party of the first part, and William Iselin & Company of New York, as now or hereafter constituted party of the second part, Witnesseth, that said Woodside Cotton Mills Company for and in consideration of the sum of One Dollar (\$1.00) to them in hand paid, receipt of which is hereby acknowledged does agree to lease and hereby leases unto the said party of the second part, Warehouses 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, and Storage Compartment in Cloth Room, situated at Greenville, S.C. Said warehouses and Compartment to be used by said William Iselin & Company for the storing of the goods and cotton of the said Woodside Cotton Mills Company. Said warehouses and Compartment to bear a sign designating that they contain the property of William Iselin & Company.

The Woodside Cotton Mills Company further agree to carry insurance on contents of said Warehouses aggregating 90% of the total value, and endorse said insurence over to William Iselin & Company. This lease is for one year from date and is self-renewing thereafter until terminated upon 30 days notice by either party to this lease. The Woodside Cotton Mills Company covenant that William Iselin & Company shall have quiet and undisturbed possession of said leased premises during the demised term. Merchandise delivered and to be delivered by Woodside Cotton Mills Company to the representative of William Iselin & Company and stored in aforesaid leased premises, is hereby pledged to William Iselin & Company as security for any and all advances made or to be made by William Iselin & Company to the Woodside Cotton Mills Company and William Iselin & Company are hereby accorded a lien upon all such merchandise to the amount of such advances, together with interest and all charges.

It is understood that the above described premises are now in the possession of Woodward, Baldwin & Company under lease dated December 21, 1914 and renewed from time to time; that this lease is made by the lessor and accepted by the lessee, without prejudice to the rights of Woodward, Baldwin & Company, except that Woodward, Baldwin & Company and William Iselin & Company shall be Joint lessess thereof so long as Woodward, Baldwin & Company shall have any merchandise owned by or pledged to them on storage therein; that both Woodward, Baldwin & Company and William Iselin & Company may keep merchandise belonging or pledged to them respectively in said premises without disturbance by either of the merchandise of the other; and that the tenancy of William Iselin & Company shall become exclusive only when Woodward, Baldwin & Company have removed from said Premises all the merchandise belonging or pledged to them.
