For valuable consideration, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, The Woodside National Bank of Greenville, S.C., the owner and holder of a certain judgment secured against W.B. Breyer and Frank F. Martin in the sum of Ninety-Seven + 02/100 (\$97.02) Dollars, as evidenced by Judgment Roll No. E-586 in the office of the clerk of court for Greenville County, does hereby release and forever discharge from the lien, obligation and effect of said judgment the following described property, to-wit:

All that certain piece, parcel or lot of land situate, lying and being in the State and County aforesaid, in Butler Township, on the West side of Lindsay Avenue, being known and designated as Lot No. 14 of the property belonging to Conyers, Power and Parrish, and having, according to a survey made May, 1928, by Dalton & Neese, Engineers, the following metes and bounds, to-wit:

E. 249.4 feet to an iron pin on the West side of Lindsay Avenue, which iron pin is 480 feet North of the intersection of Lindsay Avenue with the Laurens Road, and running thence with the West side of said Lindsay Avenue, N. 16 deg. 31 min. E. 90 feet to an iron pin; thence continuing with the West side of said Avenue, N. 9 deg. 14 min. W. 89.5 feet to the point of beginning.
