WHEREAS, *H. Douglas Gray and Ernest D. Easterby of Greenville S.C.*

did on the *11th* day of *July*, 192*4*, file with the Secretary of State a written Declaration signed by themselves, setting forth:

FIRST: That their names and residences are as above given.

SECOND: That the name of the proposed Corporation is *Greenville and Snow Company*

THIRD: That the principal place of business is *Greenville, S.C.*

FOURTH: That the general nature of the business which it is proposed to do is

that of a manufacturer fabricator and jobber of doors and windows, mill work, lumber and lumber products, and also to buy, sell and deal in all classes of building materials and supplies, lime, cement, sand, lumber and so on, as well as a general mercantile establishment and general manufacturing business.

FIFTH: That the amount of the capital stock is *One Hundred thousand (\$100,000.00)*

payable *in cash or property at its actual cash value or both.*

SIXTH: That the number of shares into which the capital stock is divided is *One thousand (1000.00)*

of the par value of *One Hundred (\$100.00) Dollars each.*

SEVENTH: That, after due notice, a meeting of the subscribers was held on the *29th* day of *May*, 192*4*, at which a majority of all stock in value being present in person or by proxy, the following were elected directors:

H. Douglas Gray, Ernest D. Easterby and J. P. Brightman

EIGHT: That subsequently there was elected as President *H. Douglas Gray* as Vice-President, *Ernest D. Easterby*; as Secretary, *J. P. Brightman* as Treasurer, *J. P. Brightman*

NINTH: That all requirements of Chapter ~~XXXV~~ *1* Article I, of the Civil Code of South Carolina, 1922, and all amendments thereto, have been duly and fully complied with, 50 per cent. of the aggregate amount of the capital stock having been subscribed by bona fide subscribers, 20 per cent. of the capital stock subscribed having been paid to the Treasurer, and three days' public notice of the intention to file this Declaration with the Secretary of State having been given in *The Greenville News* newspaper published in the County of *Greenville*

NOW, THEREFORE, I, *W. P. Blackwell* Secretary of State, by virtue of the authority in me vested by the aforesaid Code and Acts amendatory thereto, do hereby certify that the said Company has been fully organized according to the laws of South Carolina, under the name and for the purposes indicated in their written declaration, and that they are fully authorized to commence business under their charter; and I do hereby direct that a copy of this certificate be filed and recorded in the office of the Register of Mesne Conveyance or Clerk of Court in each county where such Corporation shall have a business office.
