- FIRST: That their names and residences are as above given.
- SECOND: That the name of the proposed Corporation is Edwards Realty Corporation
- THIRD: That the principal place of business is Greenville, S.C.

FOURTH: That the general nature of the business which it is proposed to do is to buy, sell, exchange, lease, mortgage, and otherwise dispose of real estate for the purpose of making money for the stockholders and to co-operate with other similar organizations, for like purposes and to do and perform all acts necessary and requisite for the purposes aforesaid.

SIXTH: That the number of shares into which the capital stock is divided is one hundred (100) of the par value of one hundred (\$1,000.00) Dollars

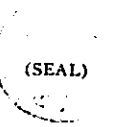

EIGHT: That subsequently there was elected as President W.T. Edwards as Vice-President L.A. Greene; as Secretary, Artie M. Wilson as Treasurer, Artie M. Wilson

NINTH: That all requirements of Chapter XIV, Article I, of the Civil Code of South Carolina, 1922, and all amendments thereto, have been duly and fully complied with, 50 per cent. of the aggregate amount of the capital stock having been subscribed by bona fide subscribers, 20 per cent. of the capital stock subscribed having been paid to the Treasurer, and three days' public notice of the intention to file this Declaration with the Secretary of State having been given in The Piedmont a new paper published in the County of Greenville
