EXECUTIVE DEPARTMENT WHEREAS, Margaret Bramlett, Mrs. Jan K. Bramlett and Claude H. Bramlett

did on the 24th day of March, 1925, file with the Secretary of State a written Declaration signed by themselves, setting forth:

FIRST: That their names and residences are as above given. SECOND: That the name of the proposed Corporation is The Margaret Bramlett Private Hospital THIRD: That the principal place of business is Greenville, S.C.
