EXECUTIVE DEPARTMENT WHEREAS, Henry Smith, W.M. Shelton and Henry Theodore all of Greenville, S.C.

did on the 12th day of May, 1926, file with the Secretary of State a written Declaration signed by themselves, setting forth:

FIRST: That their names and residences are as above given.  
SECOND: That the name of the proposed Corporation is Greenville Bus Terminal  
THIRD: That the principal place of business is Greenville, S.C.

FOURTH: That the general nature of the business which it is proposed to do is to build, erect, construct and structure a bus terminal, occupy, maintain and operate buildings for bus terminal purposes, to keep, conduct, manage, construct and operate in connection with said bus terminal restaurants, lunch rooms, barber shops, and for the accommodation of the public and of individuals, and to do all other things which may be necessary or incident to the said business, and to transact all business conferred upon similar Corporations by the laws of the State of South Carolina.

FIFTH: That the amount of the capital stock is one thousand (\$1,000.00) Dollars, payable in cash, property or services

SIXTH: That the number of shares into which the capital stock is divided is ten (10) of the par value of one hundred (\$100.00) Dollars

SEVENTH: That, after due notice, a meeting of the subscribers was held on the 8th day of May, 1926, at which a majority of all stock in value being present in person or by proxy, the following were elected directors: W.M. Shelton, Henry Smith, Joel W. Wright, Henry Theodore, C. E. Shipman, H. A. Bass and Frank L. Wilkinson

EIGHT: That subsequently there was elected as President Henry Smith as Vice-President, C. E. Shipman; as Secretary, H. A. Bass as Treasurer, H. A. Bass

NINTH: That all requirements of Chapter XXXV, 1 Article I, of the Civil Code of South Carolina, 1922 and all amendments thereto, have been duly and fully complied with, 50 per cent. of the aggregate amount of the capital stock having been subscribed by bona fide subscribers, 20 per cent. of the capital stock subscribed having been paid to the Treasurer, and three days' public notice of the intention to file this Declaration with the Secretary of State having been given in The Greenville News, a newspaper published in the County of Greenville

NOW, THEREFORE, I, W.P. Blackwell, Secretary of State, by virtue of the authority in me vested by the aforesaid Code and Acts amendatory thereto, do hereby certify that the said Company has been fully organized according to the laws of South Carolina, under the name and for the purposes indicated in their written declaration, and that they are fully authorized to commence business under their charter; and I do hereby direct that a copy of this certificate be filed and recorded in the office of the Register of Mesne Conveyance or Clerk of Court in each county where such Corporation shall have a business office.
