NOW, therefore, Know all Men by these Presents, That I, E. Inman, Master in and for the County of Greenville, aforesaid, in consideration of the sum of Thirty-five hundred twenty (\$3520.00), Dollars, to me paid by the said Otus Picklesimer and T.E. Picklesimer,

the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, HAVE GRANTED, bargained, sold and released, and by these Presents DO GRANT, bargain, sell and release unto the said,

Otus Picklesimer and T.E. Picklesimer, their Heirs and assigns forever, the following described real estate:
Tract No. 1- All that certain piece, parcel or tract of land situated, lying and being in Bates Township, Greenville County, S.C., and known as the "Grist Tract" and described as Lot No. 4 in the plat of J.G. Malley made Oct. 9, 1901, and containing 37- $\frac{1}{2}$ acres, more or less, adjoining lands of Mrs. Mary Pool, Tract No. 3 and Wade Pool's land, and having the following metes and bounds, according to a re-survey made by W.A. Hester Sept. 9, 1914: Beginning on a poplar end running thence S. 87- $\frac{1}{2}$ E. 21-57 to a stone; thence S. 9- $\frac{1}{4}$ W. 7-65 to R.O. on; thence S. 5- $\frac{1}{2}$ E. 4-50 to a stake; thence S. 33- $\frac{1}{2}$ E. 4-00 to a stake; thence S. 70 W. to a stone on line of Earle Hawkins; thence along the line of Earle Hawkins to a pine stump; thence S. 9- $\frac{1}{4}$ W. 1-50 to a stone; to a poplar, the beginning, and being the same tract of land conveyed to the said T.W. Kilgore base place and having the following metes and bounds, as shown by plat of the property of the T.W. Picklesimer Estate, made by C.I. Furman, Jr., January 29, 1926, to-wit: Beginning at an iron pin in the south line of the Jerry J. Kilgore place, this being the south side of a 20 foot road leading to the Lowndes-Hill-Road, and running thence along the line of the R.W. Watson land N. 38-45 E. 555 feet to an iron pin; thence continuing along the line of the Watson land N. 54-45 W. 320 feet to an iron pin on the south side of the aforesaid road; thence along the south line of said road S. 44-45 E. 609 feet to the beginning corner and containing 6- $\frac{1}{2}$ acres, more or less, and being one of the tracts of land conveyed to T.W. Tract No. 3- All that certain piece, parcel or tract of land situated, lying and being in Saluda Township, Greenville County, S.C., and having the following metes and bounds, to-wit: Beginning at a stake in a branch and running thence N. 64 E. 10-18 to a stone; thence N. 18 W. 5-23 to a stake; thence N. 65- $\frac{1}{2}$ W. 4-90 to a stake in a branch; thence down said branch as a line 22-54 to its confluence with another branch; thence up and with said other branch 24-54 to the beginning, containing 35 acres, more or less, and being the same tract of land conveyed to the said T.W. Picklesimer by W.L. Brooks by deed dated March 4, 1910, which deed is recorded in the R.I.C. Office for Greenville County in Deed Book Vol. 8, at page 50."
