

The State of South Carolina } Release of Land
County of Greenville } from Judgment

Whereas, the South Carolina Savings Bank as Receiver of the Peoples Bank of Fountain Inn, by a Decree of the Court of Common Pleas for Greenville County, S. C., has been authorized and empowered to execute this release, now Therefore,

Under the authority of the Decree aforesaid and in consideration of the sum of Ten Dollars, the said The South Carolina Savings Bank, as Receiver of the Peoples Bank of Fountain Inn, does hereby release unto E. C. Cass, his heirs and assigns, forever, from the lien of that certain Judgment, entered in the office of the Clerk of the Court of Common Pleas for said County and designated as Judgment Roll No. C-2646, the following described land to wit:

All that certain piece, parcel or lot of land in Greenville County, South Carolina beginning at an iron pin on the northern side of the Augusta Road, 85 feet east of Curleton Street, and running thence N 57-06 E 213.4 feet to an iron pin; thence S 55-30 E 64 feet to an iron pin in line of West property; thence with line of said property S 49-04 W 205.2 feet to an iron pin on Augusta Road; thence along the northern side of said road N 54-35 W 94 feet to the beginning corner, and,

Being almost the same lot of land conveyed to E. C. Cass by deed of W. E. Workman dated May 1, 1924 and recorded in the R. M. C. office for Greenville County in Deed Book 92 Page 428.
