at which a majority of all stock in value being present in person or by proxy, the following were elected directors: E. G. Bailey, J. S. McClinton, R. M. Hughes and M. L. Davenport

EIGHT: That subsequently there was elected as President R. M. Hughes, as Vice-President E. G. Bailey, as Secretary M. L. Davenport, as Treasurer M. L. Davenport

NINTH: That all requirements of Chapter XLVII, L, Article I, of the Civil Code of South Carolina, 1922, and all amendments thereto, have been duly and fully complied with, 50 per cent. of the aggregate amount of the capital stock having been subscribed by bona fide subscribers, 20 per cent. of the capital stock subscribed having been paid to the Treasurer, and three days' public notice of the intention to file this Declaration with the Secretary of State having been given in The Greenville News newspaper published in the County of Greenville
