WHEREAS, M. A. Price and J. L. Davis

did on the 11th day of June, 1928, file with the Secretary of State a written Declaration signed by themselves, setting forth:

FIRST: That their names and residences are as above given. SECOND: That the name of the proposed Corporation is United Manufacturing Company

THIRD: That the principal place of business is Greenville, S. C.

FOURTH: That the general nature of the business which it is proposed to do is Manufacture, buy and sell or exchange, confectionaries, Candies, relishes, and other mixtures, and engage in a wholesale or retail business with full power to own land, mortgage or sell the same, to borrow money and do all and singular anything that may be necessary or desirable in carrying on a general mercantile and or manufacturing business.

SEVENTH: That, after due notice, a meeting of the subscribers was held on the 5th day of June, 1928, at which a majority of all stock in value being present in person or by proxy, the following were elected directors: M. A. Price, M. E. Davis and J. L. Davis

EIGHT: That subsequently there was elected as President M. A. Price, as Vice-President J. L. Davis, and as Secretary J. L. Davis, as Treasurer J. L. Davis

NINTH: That all requirements of Chapter 2477, Article I, of the Civil Code of South Carolina, 1922, and all amendments thereto, have been duly and fully complied with, 50 per cent. of the aggregate amount of the capital stock having been subscribed by bona fide subscribers, 20 per cent. of the capital stock subscribed having been paid to the Treasurer, and three days' public notice of the intention to file this Declaration with the Secretary of State having been given in Greenville News newspaper published in the County of Greenville

NOW, THEREFORE, I, W. P. Blackwell, Secretary of State, by virtue of the authority in me vested by the aforesaid Code and Acts amendatory thereto, do hereby certify that the said Company has been fully organized according to the laws of South Carolina, under the name and for the purposes indicated in their written declaration, and that they are fully authorized to commence business under their charter; and I do hereby direct that a copy of this certificate be filed and recorded in the office of the Register of Mesne Conveyance or Clerk of Court in each county where such Corporation shall have a business office.
