WHEREAS, George J. Garrett of Charlotte, N.C. and S. St. Garrett of Greenville S.C.

did on the 21st day of January, 1929, file with the Secretary of State a written Declaration signed by themselves, setting forth:

FIRST: That their names and residences are as above given.

SECOND: That the name of the proposed Corporation is Piedmont Music Co., of South Carolina, Inc.

THIRD: That the principal place of business is Greenville S.C.

FOURTH: That the general nature of the business which it is proposed to do is manufacturing, buying, selling, dealing in, leasing, renting and operating musical instruments of every kind, character and description, including mechanical musical devices, sheet music, records and musical parts and supplies of all kinds, owning and operating stores and shows, and doing all things necessary or incident to such business.

FIFTH: That the amount of the capital stock is Ten Thousand (\$10,000.00) Dollars,

payable in cash at call of Directors

SIXTH: That the number of shares into which the capital stock is divided is one hundred (100) of the par value of One Hundred (\$100.00) Dollars

SEVENTH: That, after due notice, a meeting of the subscribers was held on the 28th day of December, 1928, at which a majority of all stock in value being present in person or by proxy, the following were elected directors:

J. M. Garrett, S. St. Garrett and George J. Garrett

EIGHT: That subsequently there was elected as President, J. M. Garrett as Vice-President, George J. Garrett as Secretary, S. St. Garrett as Treasurer, George J. Garrett

NINTH: That all requirements of Chapter XLVII, L, Article I, of the Civil Code of South Carolina, 1922, and all amendments thereto, have been duly and fully complied with, 50 per cent. of the aggregate amount of the capital stock having been subscribed by bona fide subscribers, 20 per cent. of the capital stock subscribed having been paid to the Treasurer, and three days' public notice of the intention to file this Declaration with the Secretary of State having been given in Greenville News a newspaper published in the County of Greenville

NOW, THEREFORE, I, St. P. Blackwell, Secretary of State, by virtue of the authority in me vested by the aforesaid Code and Acts amendatory thereto, do hereby certify that the said Company has been fully organized according to the laws of South Carolina, under the name and for the purposes indicated in their written declaration, and that they are fully authorized to commence business under their charter; and I do hereby direct that a copy of this certificate be filed and recorded in the office of the Register of Mesne Conveyance or Clerk of Court in each county where such Corporation shall have a business office.
