SECOND: That the name of the proposed Corporation is Robert G. Barr Company,

THIRD: That the principal place of business is at or near Greenville, S. C.

FOURTH: That the general nature of the business which it is proposed to do is...

to manufacture, buy, sell and deal in substances of any kind which may be used in bleaching, degumming, dyeing, printing, finishing and treating in any manner cotton, silk, artificial silk, rayon, straw, fibre and any other materials; goods or articles made therefrom and any products thereof; to manufacture, buy, sell and deal in any such materials, goods, articles and products; to bleach, degum, dye, print, finish and treat in any manner any such materials, goods, articles and products, to conduct research work in chemistry and other branches of science and art; to apply for, obtain, register, purchase, lease or otherwise acquire and to hold, use, own, operate and introduce and to sell, assign or otherwise dispose of any trademarks, trade names, patents, inventions, improvements and processes; or any interests therein, or licenses for the use thereof; to buy, store, sell, exchange and deal in (directly, on commission or in any other manner) any goods, wares and merchandise of any varieties whatever; to engage in any other manufacturing or commercial business or businesses of any kind whatsoever; to establish branches and agencies in the United States and elsewhere; to organize, promote and finance industrial, commercial and other corporations and enterprises in the State of South Carolina and elsewhere; to engage in domestic and foreign commerce; to import and export merchandise; to lease, construct, acquire, maintain, operate, mortgage and sell factories, warehouses, offices and all structures and appliances used in the operation of any business in which such corporation may engage, or for investment, as well as any other property, real and personal, either within or out of the State of South Carolina; to issue its capital stock from time to time for such consideration as may be fixed from time to time by its board of directors; to purchase and otherwise acquire, retire, cancel, redeem and reissue its own stock, so far as may be permitted by law; and to do each and every thing necessary, convenient, suitable or proper for the accomplishment of any of the purposes or the attainment of any one or more of the objects herein enumerated, or which shall at any time appear conducive to or expedient for the protection or benefit of this corporation.

payable in money or in property or in labor.
