WHEREAS, R. C. Ashmore and John P. Ashmore, both of Greenville, S. C.

did on the 8th day of June, 1923, file with the Secretary of State a written Declaration signed by themselves, setting forth:

FIRST: That their names and residences are as above given. SECOND: That the name of the proposed Corporation is Greenville Grading and Construction Company

THIRD: That the principal place of business is Greenville, S. C.

FOURTH: That the general nature of the business which it is proposed to do is grading and general road building and construction work and generally exercise all powers conferred by law on business corporations.

NINTH: That all requirements of Chapter XXXX L Article I, of the Civil Code of South Carolina, 1922 and all amendments thereto, have been duly and fully complied with, 50 per cent. of the aggregate amount of the capital stock having been subscribed by bona fide subscribers, 20 per cent. of the capital stock subscribed having been paid to the Treasurer, and three days' public notice of the intention to file this Declaration with the Secretary of State having been given in Greenville Piedmont a newspaper published in the County of Greenville

NOW, THEREFORE, I, W. P.
