WHEREAS, G. C. Gore, J. P. Carlisle, B. J. Seigler, L. A. Bernhardt, George S. Hudson, N. W. Wright, C. F. Legumohorn, J. P. Williams, M. B. Black, and J. A. Stone all of Greenville, S. C.

did on the 1st day of June, 1931, file with the Secretary of State a written Declaration signed by themselves, setting forth:

FIRST: That their names and residences are as above given.

SECOND: That the name of the proposed Corporation is Greenville Fraternal Co-operation Credit Union.

THIRD: That the principal place of business is Greenville, S. C.

FOURTH: That the general nature of the business which it is proposed to do is to loan money at reasonable rates of interest to its members, interest not to exceed seven per cent per annum, receive deposits from non-members as well as members, buy and sell real estate, promote thrift among its members and to enable them when in need to obtain for productive and provident purposes moderate loans of money for short periods at reasonable rates of interest, and to do and perform such other business and transactions as are incident and necessary to carry on successfully the business of a co-operative union.

FIFTH: That the amount of the capital stock is unlimited Dollars,

payable at the time of subscription or in monthly installments.

SIXTH: That the number of shares into which the capital stock is divided is unlimited of the par value of Five (\$5.00)

SEVENTH: That, after due notice, a meeting of the subscribers was held on the 22nd day of May, 1931, at which a majority of all stock in value being present in person or by proxy, the following were elected directors:

L. A. Bernhardt, B. J. Seigler, Geo S. Hudson, J. P. Carlisle, N. W. Wright, C. F. Legumohorn, and Dr. G. C. Gore

EIGHT: That subsequently there was elected as President G. C. Gore as Vice-President, J. P. Carlisle; as Secretary, L. A. Bernhardt as Treasurer, B. J. Seigler

NINTH: That all requirements of Chapter XLVIII, Article 17 of the Civil Code of South Carolina, 1912, 1922 and all amendments thereto, have been duly and fully complied with, 50 per cent of the aggregate amount of the capital stock having been subscribed by bona fide subscribers, 20 per cent of the capital stock subscribed having been paid to the Treasurer, and three days' public notice of the intention to file this Declaration with the Secretary of State having been given in a newspaper published in the County of Greenville

NOW, THEREFORE, I, W. P. Blackwell, Secretary of State, by virtue of the authority in me vested by the aforesaid Code and Acts amendatory thereto, do hereby certify that the said Company has been fully organized according to the laws of South Carolina, under the name and for the purposes indicated in their written declaration, and that they are fully authorized to commence business under their charter; and I do hereby direct that a copy of this certificate be filed and recorded in the office of the Register of Meane Conveyance or Clerk of Court in each county where such Corporation shall have a business office.
