H. Allen, on east by lands now or formerly of C. F. Baugne on the west by Burncombe Road being the same tract of land conveyed to H. H. Putman by C. F. Bridwell by his deed dated Oct. 20, 1923 recorded in Deed Book 92 at page 106.
