Amaryllis Lide, Mary Lou Lide, Sad Lide and Thel
Lide, by reason of the construction, operation and
maintenance of the sewer disposal system near the property
of the said parties, the said Greater Greenville Sewer
District being discharged and forever released from
any liability whatsoever growing out of the construction
and past, present or future operation of said plant.

The following is a description of the premises
affected by this release:

All that tract or parcel of land situated, lying and
being in the County of Greenville, State of South Carolina,
consisting of two tracts, containing ten acres and sixty
acres, more or less, respectively, being the same land
described in deed from L. J. Morgan to B. J. Lide,
dated August 21, 1904, recorded in Book N. N. N., Page 71,
in the office of the S. M. C. for Greenville County. The
said B. J. Lide died intestate, leaving as his only
heirs at law and distributees his wife, Etta L. Lide,
and his children hereinabove named in this
release.
