HAVE GRANTED, conveyed and released, and by these presents, DO GRANT, convey and release unto the said H. E. Plumblee

"All that certain piece, parcel or lot of land
situate in Chick Springs Township, Greenville County,
South Carolina, and being on what is known as
St. Mark Road and being designated as Lot No. 3,
as shown on plat made by J. Earle Freeman, Oct-
ober 10, 1935, and having the following meter and
bounds, to-wit:

Beginning at a point in center of St. Mark
Road, corner of J. L. McConnell lot (Lot No. 2); thence
N. 70 1/4 E. 257 1/2 feet to iron pin; thence S. 67 E. 207 feet
to iron pin; corner of Lot No. 4; thence S. 89 3/4 W. 172.5
feet to iron pin; thence S. 66 W. 225 feet to a point
in center of St. Mark Road; thence, with said road,
N. 23 W. 103 feet to the beginning corner, and contain-
