demanding relief as to the real estate described in the complaint: and the cause being at issue, came on to be heard on the 30th
day of April 1937, and such proceedings were had therein as resulted in a decree of the said Court, whereby it was
adjudged and decreed that the said real estate hereinafter mentioned and described, be conveyed by E. Inman
Master in and for the County aforesaid, to Walker Wright.

NOW, Therefore, Know all Men by these Presents, that I, E. Inman
Master, in and for the County of Greenville aforesaid, by virtue of the aforesaid decree.

HAVE GRANTED, conveyed and released, and by these presents, DO GRANT, convey and release unto the said Walker Wright

"All that lot of land near the Eastern limits
of the City of Greenville, in Greenville County, South
Carolina, in the section known as "Nichol Town"
containing about one acre, being the lot of land
described as follows:

Near the Nichol Town Road and fronting on an
unnamed street shown on Block Book 66 of the City
of Greenville, S. C. according to a survey of W. D.
News, City Engineer, dated March 1924. This lot
adjoins land of Cliff Walker, Florence Byrd and
Henry Theodore, and being the same lot of land
inherited by Walker Wright, Sr. from his mother
Mary Martin Wright, and on which lot there is
a four room house"
