All that piece, parcel or lot of land lying in Greenville County, state aforesaid on the head waters of Enoree river, about one-half mile east of Enoree Baptist church, containing fifty-five acres, more or less, and being bounded by the lands of J. E. Clark on the north, W. W. Black on the east, J. P. Gilreath on the south and by lands belonging to A. T. Hart, on the west and more particularly described as follows:

Beginning at an iron pin in the New Pine Log Ford road, contiguous to the land of J. P. Gilreath and running N. 11 1/2 E. 10.60 to B. gum; thence due north 10.60 to poplar; thence N. 2 W. 13.18 to iron pin; thence S. 44 1/2 W. 14.66 to stake; thence S. 16 E. 9.70 to stone; thence N. 60 1/2 W. 13.10 to stake; thence S. 7 W. 23.45 to pine; thence S. 7 W. 8.02 to stake in road; thence S. 70 E. 5.20 to point in road; thence S. 65 E. 4.00 to stone in bend of road; thence N. 62 E. 13.05 to beginning point, as appears by reference to plat made by M.
