to W. H. Stepp, of Greenville County,  
and before the sealing of these presents by Laylone, South Carolina,

(the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, have Granted, Bargained, Sold and Released, and by these presents do Grant, Bargain, Sell and Release unto the said

J. W. Stepp and his heirs and assigns, the  
following described parcel of land, situated in  
Jelinda Township, Greenville County, State of South  
Carolina, on some branch entire of South Syger  
Road, being part of the tract of land granted  
Jeremiah Grammill on the 15th day of October 1854,  
and also a piece of land conveyed to said Jeremiah  
Grammill by the Sheriff of Greenville County in sale  
of property of Alexander McKinney; Beginning at  
the chestnut oak and rune thence South 73 1/2 West  
12.45 chains to a black gum, thence South 36 1/2 West  
10.50 chains to a stone, thence South 87 1/2 East  
22.25 chains to a stone, thence South 18 1/2 West  
11.15 chains to a sawwood (low), thence South 87 1/2  
East 26.50 chains to a stake, thence North 9 West  
15.50 chains to a stake in the branch, thence up  
the meanders of said branch 34 chains to a stake  
in the branch on William Turner's line (now Archie  
Turner); thence South 27 West 8.54 chains to the  
beginning chestnut oak, containing eighty-five (85)  
acres, more or less. Bounded by the lands of J. P.  
Pitman, Archie Turner, Northule Newman and others,  
and being the same land conveyed to William H.  
Paole by John H. Paole by deed dated the 29th day  
of June 1910, and duly recorded in said Greenville  
County, S. C., in office of Register of Mense Conveyance  
in Vol. 9, page 7, to which deed reference is made for  
further chain of title.
