(The receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, Law Granted, Purpoted, Sold and Released, and by these presents do Grant, Bargain, Sell and Release unto the said

*M. J. McHugh, his heirs and assigns forever,
That certain tract or plantation of lands situate in the
County and State aforesaid, on the road known as
the Anderson Bridge Road, leading to Anderson Court
House,*

*Beginning at a forked red oak, old corner, and
running thence N. 18° E. 6.30 to a T. R. (gone) now a
stake, thence N. 72° E. 11.25 to a stake in the middle of
the new State Horse Road, thence S. 24° E. 10.16 to a
stake in the cross of the Anderson and White Horse
Roads, thence S. 44° E. 0.37 to a stake in middle of
said Anderson Road, thence S. 46° E. 7.00 to a stake in
end of said road, thence S. 61° E. 8.52 to a bend in
the road, thence S. 65° E. 11.25 to a bend in the road,
thence S. 81° E. 11.42 to a bend, thence S. 67° E. 11.52 to a
stake in the middle of the Anderson Road, thence N.
21° E. 11.37 to a stake in edge of old field, thence N.
51° E. 11.30 to the beginning, containing 38 1/2 acres,
more or less, and being the same tract of land con-
veyed unto Melville S. McHugh by J. A. Bounce by
deed dated Jan. 20, 1873, recorded in the office of R. M.
for Greenville County in Book "C.C." at page 374, of
which said land the said Melville S. McHugh did
die and possessed.*

*Also: All that tract of land containing 11 acres, more
or less, situate and lying in the County and State aforesaid,
on the east side of the Anderson Road about 3 1/2
miles from Greenville Court House, being the same land
conveyed unto Lou C. McHugh by Jefferson Edwards by his
deed dated Jan. 5, 1893, recorded in the office of R. M. C.
for Greenville County in Book "B.B.13" at page 193, this
being the tract of land of which Lou C. McHugh did die and
possessed.*

*This being the tract of land conveyed to M. J. McHugh by
C. H. McHugh, et al., by deed dated Oct. 2, 1921, and recorded
in R. M. C. Office for Greenville County in Vol. 65, page 174,
and being the same tract of land conveyed by M. J. McHugh
to C. C. & M. J. McHugh, by deed dated the 1st day of September
1925, and recorded in Vol. 107, page 27, R. M. C. Office for
Greenville County."*
