Know all men by these presents that James C. Noah, of the State of South Carolina, for and consideration of the sum of Two Hundred \$200.00 Dollars, to me paid by Duke Power Company, a corporation of persons under the laws of the State of New Jersey, in the State aforesaid, except whereof reserving acknowledgement, has granted to said Duke Power Company, its successors and assigns, their right privilege and easement to back water over and upon, through or across, from the hereinbefore described tract of land to any extent deemed necessary or desirable by said Duke Power Company, its successors and assigns of these premises, the construction and maintenance of dams, mills, hydroelectric plants, reservoirs, structures, buildings, roads, and other improvements therefor to be constructed and kept up.

The tract of land above which said rights and easements are hereby granted is described as follows:

All that piece of land lying and being in the Dukeville ownership, known as the Conley's Barren Company, a division of the large mineral property of Wesley Bellamy, Henry Shumate, Creek Moore and George L. and son training 130 Acres, more or less, and being the same land conveyed to James C. Noah by W. Morris et al., Deed dated December 11, 1908, recorded at the office of Greenville County, Georgia, at page 172.

I do hereby affirm, acknowledge and agree that the considerations herein before stated, and paid to me are free settlement, satisfaction and payment of any and all damages that may be caused to the said lands by the use of the said lands for the purpose of the erection, construction and maintenance of said Turkey Flats Reservoir or Lake or the structures thereto erected and maintained.

I so understand and agreed that I reserve the right to cultivate, pasture, or otherwise use and enjoy all of said lands not used or occupied by the privilege and easement hereby granted.

See the event Duke Power Company, its successors or assigns, shall cause to use and maintain the dam and plant at Turkey Flats, or any removal of same as aforesaid, or to the floor or back water over and upon said lands, the use of easement is to close and determine and said land is to revert to the said James C. Noah, his heirs and assigns, free and clear of the easement herein provided.

To have and to hold, all and singular the right, privilege and easements hereinabove set out unto said Duke Power Company, its successors and assigns forever.

And I do hereby bind myself, my heirs, executors and administrators to warrant and forever defend all and singular the said premises unto said Duke Power Company, its successors and assigns, against
